Telephones, Cell Phones



We would like to remind parents that students will always be allowed to use the school office telephone in EMERGENCY situations. Please make arrangements at home for after school activities or changes in pick up arrangements. Cell phones can get lost, stolen, damaged, passed around or used by children or their friends to make/take inappropriate or even dangerous calls. Students can leave their cell phones in their school bags or keep them on their person, but out of site. They are to be turned off and only used after school hours. If students are found using a cell phone, even at recess, it will be given to the office where parents will be given a call. Repeated instances will result in the cell phone having to be picked up by a parent and asked not to be at school at all. Please help us by reminding your child of these rules.

School Yard Supervision



OLR staff have been assigned school yard and bus supervision duties. Please help the staff in ensuring a safe and protected environment for all children. Please allow your child(ren) to proceed to the back of the school yard alone. This provides the student with confidence and independence. In addition, this allows staff on yard duty to more readily spot any strangers. Morning supervision begins at 8:35 a.m. so please do not have students arrive at school before this time. Please note that all staff and supply staff on duty will be wearing orange vests so that students can easily identify the supervisor on duty. Also this will assist us in quickly spotting any strangers on our playground. These steps are all taken for the safety of the OLR students.

Visitors and Visiting

Safe and Caring School Community

School Safety Week

During the last week of September, students and staff at OLR will take part in a variety of Safety Procedure Drills. Fire Drills, Lock Downs and Severe Weather will be reviewed and practiced. We will practice quickly and quietly exiting the building in the event of a fire. In addition, we will review where the safe zones are in the case of a lock down or severe weather. We will continue to practice these drills periodically throughout the year.

Freedom of Information, Emergency Forms

Emergency Procedure Forms will be brought home this week. These completed forms are critical in enabling us to reach you, the parents, or your designated emergency caregivers, in the event of an illness or an emergency. On some rare occasions, if parents cannot be reached, the Principal may need to take immediate medical action for your child that may involve hospitalization. For this reason, please make sure that ALL medical information is current, including any drug allergies or existing medical conditions that would be helpful without your presence. Please return these green forms by Monday, September 11th.

Medication at School

Our schools do not have a school nurse. Therefore, whenever possible, have your doctor schedule medication to be administered outside of school hours. If, in <u>extremely unusual circumstance</u>, your child must take medication during the school day, come to the school office and complete the required form S16 and S16a. This form **must also be signed by your physician.** Students can not have medication in their bags or desks at school. All medication must be kept in it's original container with your child's name clearly visible and will be safely locked in the school office medicine cabinet.

Lunch Drop-Offs

Children should arrive at school with their lunch in the morning. However, at times you may find it necessary to deliver lunch at school. <u>Please</u> keep lunch drop-offs to a minimum and have your child's name on the bag and deliver the lunch to the table inside the front door of the school by **11:45 p.m.**

The York Catholic District School Board has a comprehensive policy to help protect students with life threatening allergies. Protecting anaphylactic students from exposure to life threatening substances creates a major challenge to all elementary schools.

As outlined in the policy, parents are asked to inform the school of such allergies immediately and are required to fill in **S15** and **S15a** forms which are available in the office. Each form must have a passport size picture attached so that the student is easily identifiable to staff. Parents are also asked to ensure that students for whom Epi-Pens are prescribed, have two Epi-Pens at school. Twin-jet Epi-Pens are <u>not acceptable</u> for school use. One Epi-Pen should be worn by the student in a fanny pack at all times, which includes on the bus, on excursions, and on all other school related activities/sports. The other Epi-Pen must be stored in the school office for emergency use only. This Epi-Pen will also be taken on trips.



The following are avoidance strategies we will be implementing at Our Lady of the Rosary to help keep all our students safe.

- We will continue with our "nut safe" school environment via food restrictions. Students will be informed of and reminded that they are not to share food. The school environment includes entire school grounds, buses and other modes of transportation, school trips, before/after school/weekend programs, and school sanctioned events involving pupils.
- We will prohibit food outdoors to minimize exposure to insects (i.e. wasps, etc.).
- We will continue to communicate regularly to the entire school community that we are a "nut safe" school via newsletters, and posting of "nut safe" signs throughout the school.
- We will take special precautions around holidays and special celebrations, by planning activities that ensure the health and safety of our students. No cakes, cupcakes, muffins, donuts, and the like, will be allowed in the school for birthday recognition purposes. If parents are wishing to send in a "treat", non -edible treats (stickers, pencils, etc.) are encouraged.
- We will continue to ensure that all products sold through the school for fundraising or otherwise are nut safe, as well as being in keeping with the Food and Beverage Policy.

We will continue to ensure that permit holders, visitors and all school staff are aware of these precautions.

We ask that NO PRODUCTS be brought into the school that may contain nut products such as peanut butter, Nutella, certain types of chocolate bars, cookies, Tim Horton's and McDonald's products. Fresh vegetables, fruit, "no nut" granola bars, raisins, etc. make great snacks for your child and do not pose health risks. Please contact the office if you have any questions.


