Dear Parent(s)/Guardian(s):

In the month of November, the OLR school community's focus now shifts to the virtue of "Justice" and treating others with open minds and without the spectres of bias and inequity. Many of the school's learning opportunities and initiatives have been intentionally planned with the idea of removing these barriers in mind.

We look forward to our Remembrance Day service on November 11th and our intermediate classes' involvement in the Dufferin Clark Public Library and Historica Canada's virtual Remembrance with the Memory Project, as we make a humble attempt to learn more about the First Nations, Metis, and Inuit communities' participation in Canada's military efforts throughout the years, as noted in the First World War with many indigenous from the Cree Nation serving as "code talkers" and in World War II as an example. It is important to not only remember but also to acknowledge the tremendous sacrifices that many members of the indigenous communities made to serve in a Canadian uniform, considering the challenges of learning a new language, adapting to new cultural differences, and contributing finances, resources and land to support the building of Canadian installments, all in service to Canada.

The Ontario government has designated the first week of November as Treaties Recognition Week to honour the importance of treaties, to help the people of Ontario learn more about treaty rights and treaty relationships, and to enhance awareness of the treaty relationships between Indigenous and non-Indigenous communities. The grade 6 class looks forward to its virtual author visit with Indigenous author Todd Jamieson of "The Barren Grounds" fame.

November will be a busy yet rewarding month of learning in the areas of Math and STREAM education, as well as, consultation with our Safe Schools action team, as we examine school climate data and take a coordinated approach to anti-bullying. Progress report cards are scheduled to be uploaded to the Parent Portal by 4 pm on November 16th and P-T interviews are scheduled for Nov. 18 and 19th (PA Day). We look forward to working together with our CSC parent partners as we plan ahead for this year based on our school improvement goals.

TRAFFIC PROTOCOL

To continue the school year with all students' safety at the forefront, we need to ask for your increased vigilance with all of our surrounding roads. We ask for your additional attention to the safety of our students, specifically in the areas in front of our school. We need everyone's help to work for the safety of all our children.

PLEASE HELP US HELP OUR CHILDREN:

The children's safety is a concern to all of us. The expectation is that drivers will respond to traffic signs and they will be cautious when approaching the school area. As parents, it is reasonable to expect a safe "drop-off" zone for the children. Hence, the question: "Where can I stop in order to off load my child(ren)?" At Our Lady of the Rosary, parents are expected to drop off their children on Glen Shields Avenue. The city of Vaughan has placed signs directing parents that the area is a noparking zone between 8:00- and 9:30 am and 3:00-4:30 pm, Monday to Friday.

Please remember not to block any driveways and please do not park too close to the school driveways. Busses need additional space to turn safely without striking the front or back end of a stopped/parked car. U-turns are prohibited and would create a danger in any school area. As a gentle reminder, please ensure the safety of children by having them wear seatbelts correctly, at all times.

Parents dropping off or picking up students are reminded that they are not to enter the driveway after 8:20 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. as we are preparing for student arrival and dismissal. The bus loop is easily distinguishable, as it has been marked with large pylons at each end. Please do not park here, as this area is for the students to safely disembark from the bus.

In terms of students who arrive late, late slips, will no longer be issued by the main office, identical to last year's practice. <u>Late arrivals and absences</u> will be noted and marked accordingly by teachers using our digital attendance procedures and shared with secretarial staff in real time. All latecomers will enter through the front door, hand sanitize upon arrival and be directly admitted to their classroom.

Safe Arrival Promotion:

Parents/Guardians always have the option to call Safe Arrival to report a planned absence by calling 1-855-856-7862 prior to 8:50 am or visiting go.schoolmessenger.ca

- Parents are asked to bring/drop off their child(ren) as close to the bell time as possible.
- If a student is not feeling well, we ask that the student stay at home and access any work that has been provided by the school. Should a student feel ill at school, all YCDSB and York Region PH COVID-19 related protocol will be followed, the student will be supervised in a separate and secure areas, and parents will be contacted immediately to pick up the student as soon as possible.

Elementary Safe Arrival Absence Reporting Procedure

At York Catholic District School Board, one of our greatest priorities is ensuring that all our students arrive safely to school every day. Parents and/or guardians are required to report their childr(ren)'s absence or late arrival in advance, or before bell time for the current day by accessing the Elementary Safe Arrival Program using any of the three methods below:

- Toll Free SchoolMessenger Phone Number: 1 855 856 7862
- The SchoolMessenger Website: go.schoolmessenger.ca
- The SchoolMessenger App from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store.

The first time you use the App or Website, select **Sign Up** to create your account. To report an absence, select **Attendance** followed by **Report an Absence**

These options are available **24 hours a day, 7 days a week**. Future absences can be reported at any time. If you have children at a YCDSB Secondary school, you may use the SafeArrival system to report the absence for those children, as well.

Parents and/or guardians are requested to report absences for students attending in-person face to face and remote learning.

In order for this system to be successful, it is important that we have the correct contact information for you on file. If any of your phone or email contact information has changed, please contact your child's school office.

In addition, *SchoolMessenger* will send an automated notification to parents and guardians who have not reported their child(ren) as absent or late for face to face learners. If our system is unable to reach a designated contact after the required amount of time, office staff will follow up. By reporting your child(ren) absent or late in advance or before the bell time, you will not receive these notifications.

Should you have any questions in regards to the **Safe Arrival Program**, please do not hesitate to contact your child's school office.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: YORK REGION SCREENING AND TESTING UPDATES

Friday October 15, 2021

With the support of the COVID 19 vaccine and other public health measures, everyone has been working together to help keep our schools and child cares safe and we are greatly appreciative of your collective efforts.

It remains critically important to continue to screen your children for symptoms each day to avoid bringing COVID-19 into the schools and child cares and to test them when required. Screening and testing help control the spread of COVID-19. Even if you or your child is fully vaccinated, you must continue with daily screening and testing if you or your child have one or more COVID-19 symptom.

Screening update

To provide parents and guardians with more options to screen , including the ability to share results electronically and complete screening in multiple languages, effective Monday, October 18, 2021 York Region Public Health will require students, parents and guardians to use the provincial COVID-19 school and child care screening tool.

The provincial screening tool was updated on Friday October 1, 2021 to **reiterate the need to stay home if you are sick with any COVID-19 symptoms**. This information was previously missing, suggesting children with mild symptoms like runny noses and sore throats were permitted to attend school. This change brings the provincial COVID-19 school and child care screening tool in line with the York Region school and child care screening requirements.

Students, parents and guardians will still be able to access the <u>link to the tool</u> through the York Region <u>Staying Safe at School</u> webpage. All staff and students must self-screen for signs and symptoms of COVID-19 **every day** before attending school or child care. Even if you or your child is fully vaccinated, you must continue with daily screening and testing if you or your child have one or more COVID-19 symptom.

MILD SYMPTOMS

As a reminder, anyone experiencing symptoms, including mild symptoms not included on the provincial screening tool (e.g., runny nose, sore throat, etc.) should **NOT** attend school or child care. If your child has mild symptoms not listed the screening tool, they can return to school or child care once their symptoms have improved for 24 hours. If your child does have symptoms listed on the screening tool, or their symptoms get worse, they are required to have a PCR COVID-19 test or stay home for 10 days.

Remote Learning Code of Conduct

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Our teachers have been working hard to create inclusive, faith-filled, and safe learning environments for students. While some students have chosen remote learning, others may have to pivot to remote learning in the event that their class is directed by York Region Public Health to self-isolate.

To ensure the safety and privacy of students and staff working in a remote learning environment, we are highlighting expectations and code of conduct expectations for remote learners and for parents of remote learners.

The following are expectations for our remote students:

- The remote learning platform is a classroom;
- Students attending remotely are expected to show the same classroom preparedness and willingness to follow school and classroom rules, routines and expectations as if attending in-person (i.e. being presentable and dressed for learning, having learning materials ready and homework completed);
- Students are expected to be prompt and in attendance by the start of the school day. Any students who are late will be marked late and parents will receive a call from Safe Arrival.
- As in a regular classroom, remote learners are expected to show courtesy, respect and consideration for their teachers and peers. The school's code of conduct and progressive discipline apply in instances of inappropriate behavior; and,
- Where there is inappropriate behavior, the teacher will report the incident to the principal for further investigation and follow-up with parents.

Parents of remote students should note the following:

- All student absences must be reported via the Board's Safe Arrival procedures:
- The remote class is imbued with the same sanctity as a regular classroom;
- The teacher is the person of authority in the classroom and is responsible for establishing and maintaining class order and management;
- When there is any concern (i.e. live feed is not working), the parent will call the school office to report the occurrence and wait for the school administrator to respond;
- At all times, where there is concern about content, the parent will contact the teacher through established teacher-parent communication protocols including a phone call or email to the teacher. Additionally, the parent can also contact the office with any concerns. Parents are not to use the chat feature to address concerns.
- Taking pictures, video or audio recording of the live proceedings is strictly forbidden to ensure the privacy of staff and students.
- Providing unwelcome feedback/comments about the proceedings of classroom lessons on social media is inappropriate. Any comments should be addressed directly with the teacher.
- Under no circumstance during synchronous live teaching will a parent or guardian interrupt the proceeding of the classroom. As outlined in the Education Act s.212 (1), 'it is an offense for any person to wilfully interrupt or disquiet the proceedings of a school or class.'

We must work together to ensure a safe and productive learning environment for all students. This requires the commitment of all stakeholders during this difficult and unprecedented time.

Thank you in advance for your cooperation and support as we work together as a community.

Dear Parents/Guardians,

The York Catholic District School Board is pleased to offer *myBlueprint* access to grade 7 and 8 students and their parents/guardians. This letter is intended to provide you with information about this educational tool.

Students from grades 7–12 have a **digital portfolio**, called the *Individual Pathways Plan (IPP)* in Ontario schools, that can be supported by the self-assessment surveys, career exploration, educational pathways research, and secondary/post-secondary planning found in *myBlueprint*.

Students can reflect upon and showcase the results of activities they complete within *myBlueprint* using the IPP. *myBlueprint* features:

- Who Am I 6 unique assessments for self-exploration and discovery (including Learning Styles, Myers-Briggs Personality, Holland Interests, Knowledge, Motivations, and Compatibility)
- **High School** a tool to visually plan courses, track progress toward graduation, and instantly identify post-secondary eligibility for opportunities in all pathways
- Post-Secondary a database to explore post-secondary opportunities and compare detailed information on apprenticeships, college programs, university programs and workplace sectors across Canada
- Goals an interactive goal setting tool to set S.M.A.R.T. goals and action plans
- Occupations A database of over 500 occupations to compare comprehensive information on iobs
- Resumes & Cover Letters interactive tools to record personal experiences, build resumes and write cover letters
- Money an engaging budget-making tool to help students track income and expenses and develop financial literacy
- Job Search a tool to explore real-world job postings that relate to occupations of interest
- **Portfolios** a portfolio builder to create multiple portfolios and share them with parents, teachers, or future employers

In addition to the educational components supported by the platform, myBlueprint will be used extensively:

- by the Pathways and Careers Teachers in grade 7 and 8,
- by Guidance teachers for Careers in grade 10,
- and will be used for secondary course selection from grade 8 to 11.

ANAPHYLAXIS

The York Catholic District School Board has a comprehensive policy to help protect students with life threatening allergies. Protecting anaphylactic students from exposure to life threatening substances poses a major challenge for all elementary schools. As outlined in the policy, parents are asked to inform the school of such allergies immediately and are required to complete S15 and S15a forms which are available in the office. Each form must have two passport size pictures attached so that the student is easily identifiable to staff. Parents are also asked to ensure that students for whom Epi-Pens are prescribed, have two Epi-Pens at school. One Epi-Pen should be worn by the student in a waist pack at all times, which includes on the bus and on all other school related activities. The other Epi-Pen must be stored in the school office for emergency use only.







PEDICULOSIS (HEAD LICE)

The following is the annual reminder to parents about Pediculosis. Please, routinely check your child's head for live lice and/ or their nits (eggs). If you find head lice, please ask a family physician, pharmacy personnel and use a recommended treatment to destroy the lice and remove all the nits from your child's hair before they return to school. MEDICATION AT SCHOOL

Our schools do not have a school nurse. Therefore, whenever possible, have your doctor schedule medication to be administered outside of school hours. If, in extremely unusual circumstances, your child must take medication during the school day, please contact the school office to obtain and complete the required form \$16 and \$16a. These forms must also be signed by your physician. Students cannot have medication in their bags or desks at school. All medication must be kept in its original container with your child's name clearly visible and will be safely secured by school personnel in a designated area within the office.
